

Year 3-4 Curriculum Map Summer 2017

Geography

Literacy:

Fiction - Y4 We will be exploring a range of science fiction texts before developing our own ideas to help us plan and write our own Science Fiction stories! We will be focusing on applying the vocabulary and grammar work we have developed over the year. Opportunities to further develop our assessment of our own and other children's work will be incorporated throughout the unit.

Fiction - Y3 We will be exploring traditional tales. Children will explore fairy tales with a twist before planning and writing a twist to a tale of their own! Opportunities to further develop our assessment of our own and other children's work will be incorporated throughout the unit.

Non-fiction - We will be exploring the art of persuasion in a range of texts, including visual texts.

Using different persuasive techniques, we will design and produce our own persuasive texts and evaluate the effectiveness of these which will enable us to make appropriate changes.

Maths:

Y3 Children will be working on fractions, property of shapes, measure and statistics. Children will have the opportunity to develop their reasoning skills as well as applying their knowledge and skills to problem solving. We will be continuing to develop the four operations through basic skills sessions.

Y4 Children will be working on measure, focussing on perimeter and length, and geometry and statistics. Children will have the opportunity to develop their reasoning skills as well as applying their knowledge and skills to problem solving. We will be continuing to develop our recall of multiplication and division facts up to 12 x 12.

Science: In science, we will be looking at ways in which animals and plants can be classified. We will be using a range of classification trees as well as creating our own. We will explore food chains and develop our understanding of how these can be affected.

ICT: We will develop our word processing skills with the aim of increasing the pace at which we can type as well as the accuracy. We will recap on formatting text, including alignment and spacing.

Y4: We will be word processing extracts from our literacy work which we will be emailing to our penpals in order for them to give us some feedback.

Geography: In Geography, we will focus on the United Kingdom and recap basic geographical knowledge. We will explore the composition of the United Kingdom, identifying urban and rural areas, major rivers, National Parks and mountain ranges. We will reflect on geographical changes that have occurred over time.

P.E. In P.E. we will be developing skills which we can apply to a range of striking and fielding games. We will also be developing skills in athletics, which the children will be able to apply during our sports' week.

Y4: We will be taking part in swimming lessons during the second summer term.

P.H.S.C.E. We will be looking at forming and maintaining relationships with different people.
As part of the National Curriculum, we will be using the Christopher Winter material to teach Sex and Relationship Education.

Year 4: How my body changes

French: In languages, we will be revising numbers through games and exploring favourite playground games.

DT: In DT, we will be exploring the origin of different foods and develop our understanding of food miles. We will be looking at traditional food from different places around the world. Using a range of tools, the children will develop their ability to prepare a range of dishes following recipes and evaluating the success of these.

Music: In music, the children will be working with our music specialist.

Important information
