Last week year 5 started some linking work school with Foredyke Primary School. We have just had confirmation that we have established a link with

a school in Sierra Leone. It is called the Industrial and Cooperative Preparatory School, situated at Wellington which is about eleven kilometres from the Capital, Freetown. The school has been operating for twenty three

years since 1986. Since starting as a day care provision for working parents it has moved on into the formal school system providing nine vears schooling, three years pre-school and six years of the primary programme. The school caters for children from all backgrounds with the sixteen ethnic groups in Sierra Leone. They have a school community of one hundred and eighty boys and girls.
