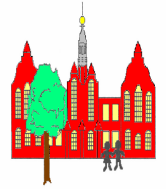

Beverley Road Programme

On Wednesday, Mr Browning joined fellow members of the Beverley Road Programme Board. This is a scheme which is being launched on Thursday 29th October at the Endeavour learning centre (formerly Endeavour High School). Supported by a National Lottery grant, it is directed at restoring many of the frontages of buildings along Beverley Road. It affects buildings from the Hull Daily Mail offices on Blundells' Corner up to the junction with Queen's Road. Over the years, buildings have become run down or their exteriors untidy and neglected. The aim is to bring back some of Beverley Road's character with buildings having some of their original Victorian and Edwardian features returned to their former glory. Ornate Railings will be installed plus there will be feature 'history' boards along the road. Our school will not be affected. Our exterior looks just like it did in 1886, when it was completed. Although many years ago, our railings were removed, they were eventually replaced. The railings we have are not the original Victorian ones but quite recent copies. The land around Stepney Railway Station will be improved. The

platform is still there on the opposite side from the station, but is overgrown. This will be cleared and new lighting installed, which will hopefully make it a better-looking and a safer area. We are hopeful that our pupils will become involved in some heritage projects, perhaps linking in with the Hull, City of Culture 2017 events.

Phase 1-2 Assembly

We had a great assembly on Thursday from our year 1 and 2 classes. They told us about things they have been studying so far this term. Starting with a rendition of 'Heads, Shoulders, Knees and Toes' and 'Dem Bones', we heard facts about the human body, and then listened to work about things in history. Everyone conquered their nerves to deliver a superb assembly. Well done to all concerned.
